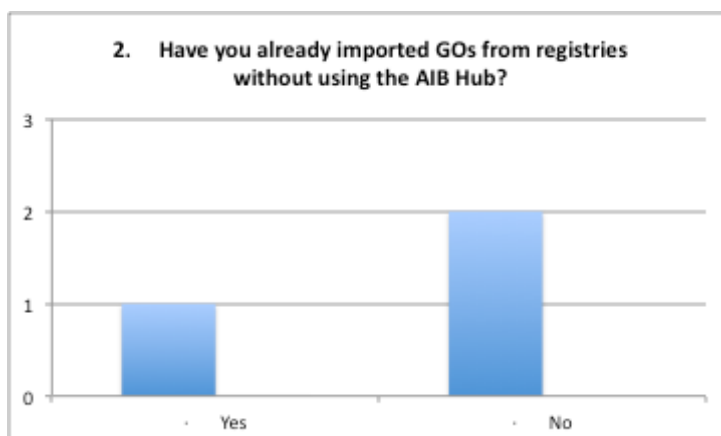
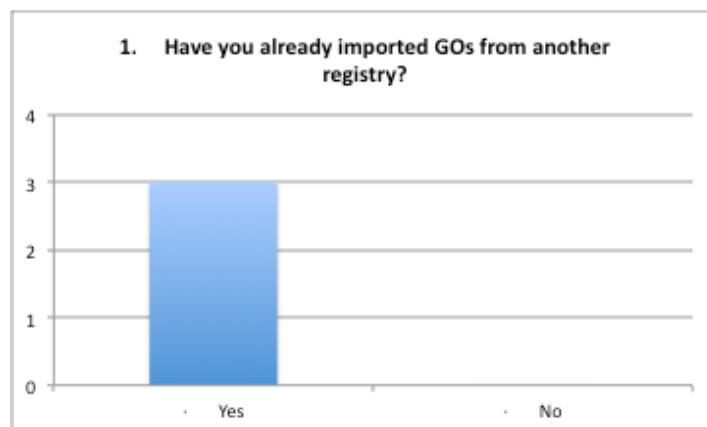
## 1 Introduction

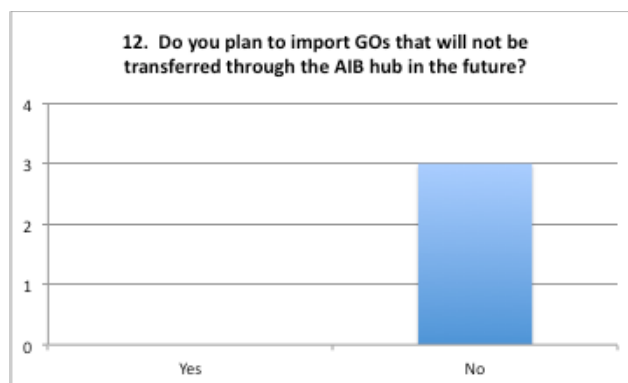
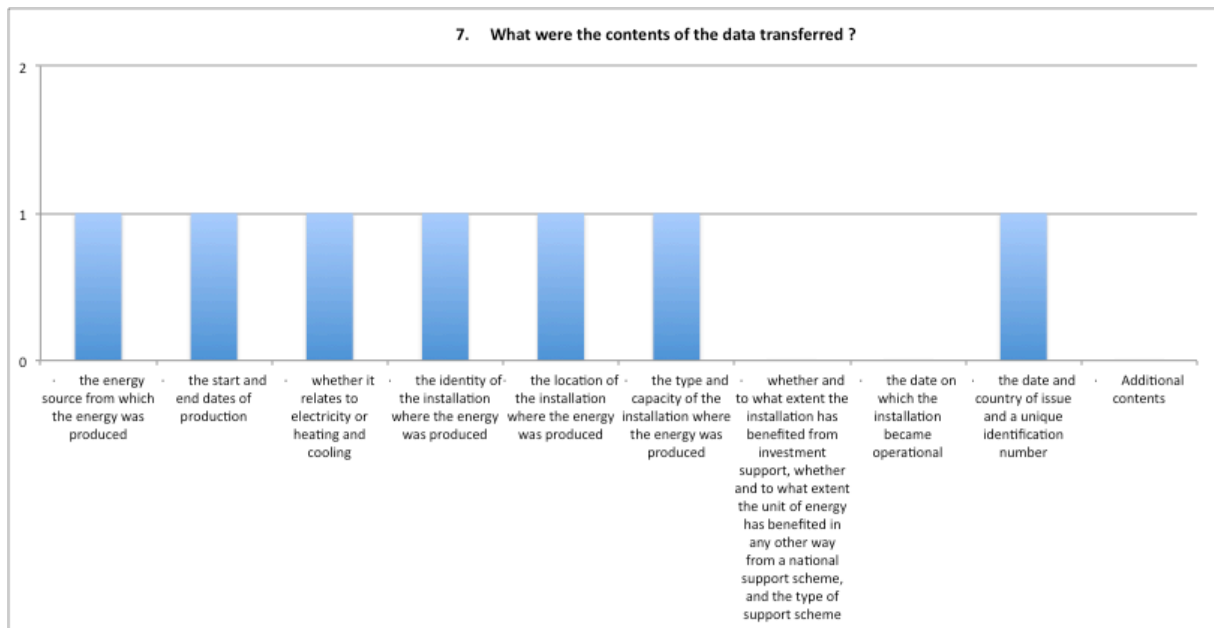
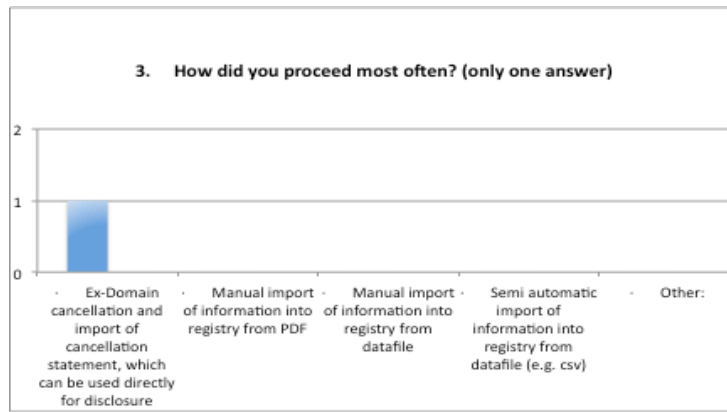

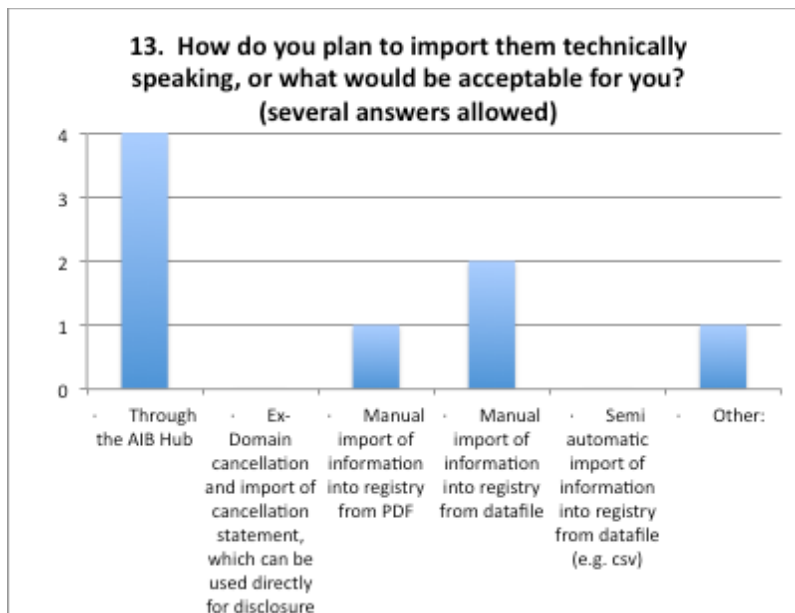
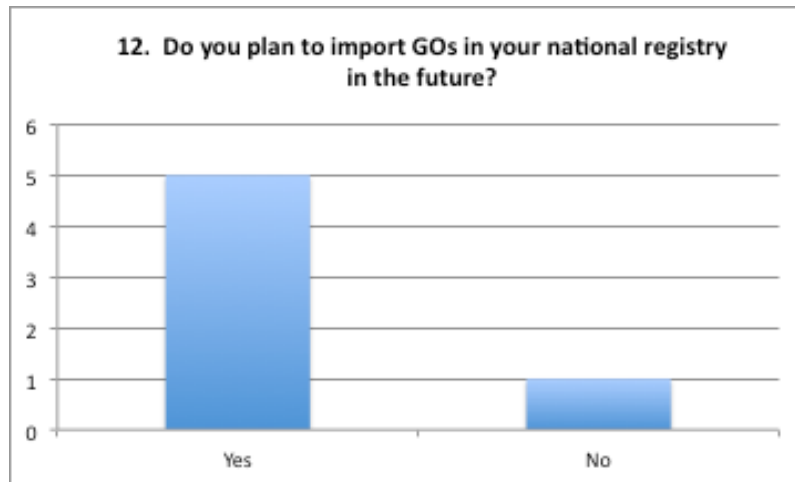


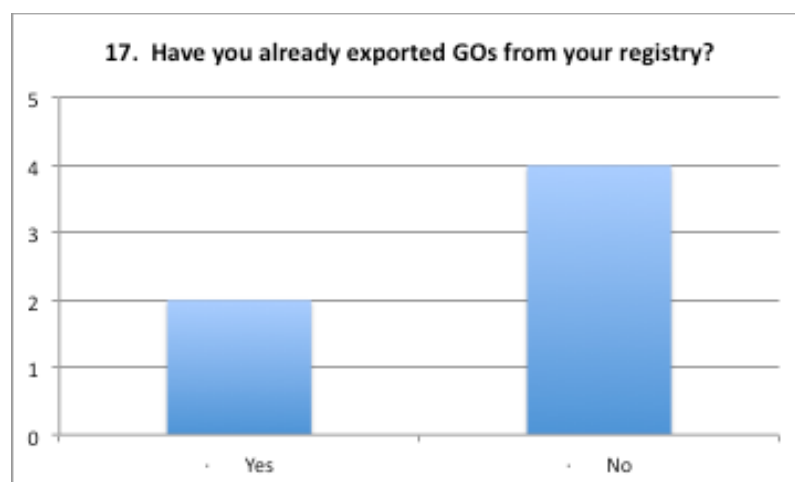
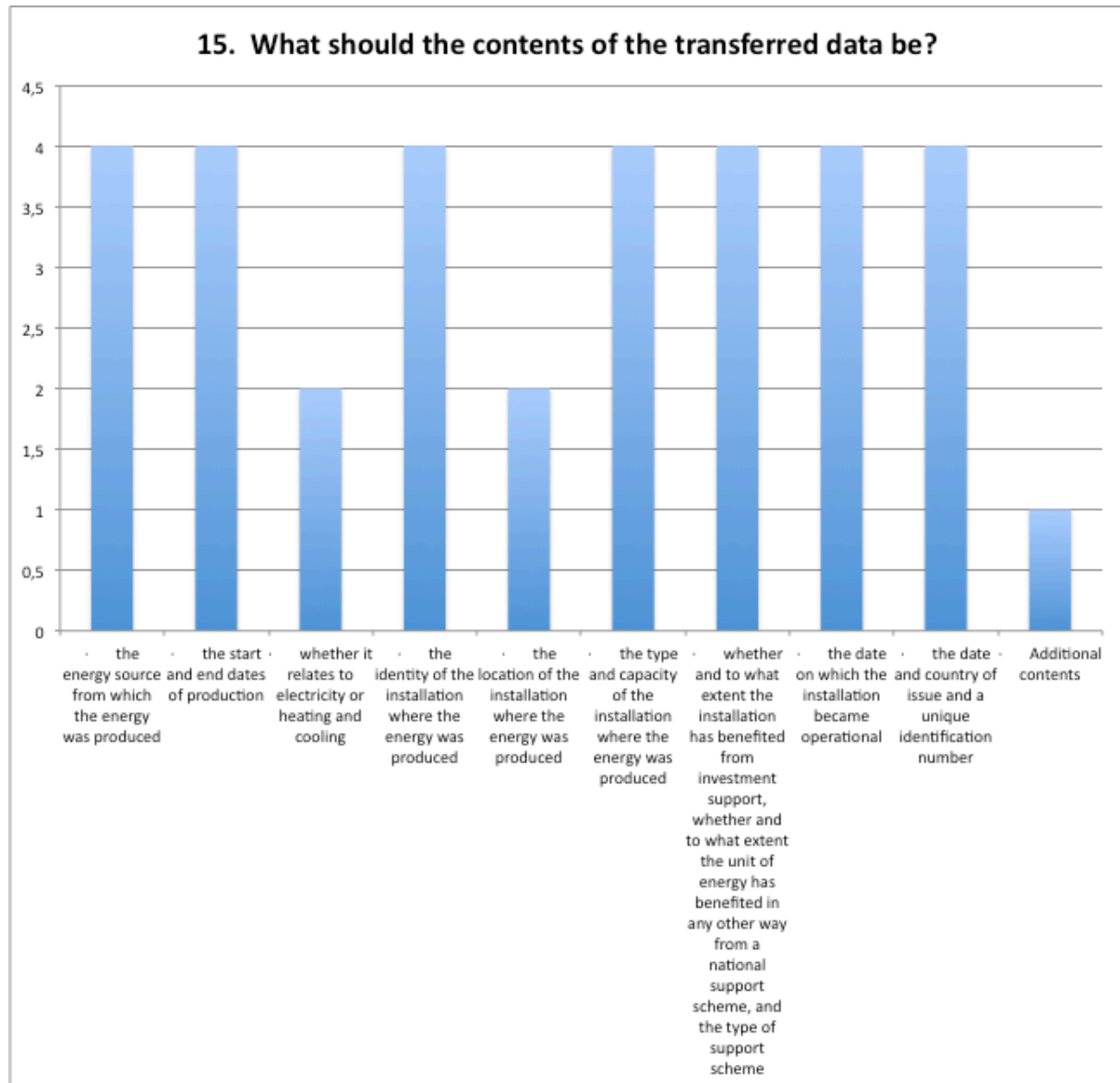
### 2.1.2 Domains not connected to the AIB Hub
